Ever been lost and confused? Dante was a gifted artist but found himself in advertising for thirty years—to pay the bills. The loss of his wife leads him into a questioning period, and like the most important journeys, Dante's journey turns inward to, as the DVD's cover explains, discover that "Sometimes your eyes don't see what your heart already knows."

One important detail taught in filmmaking school is that the story "happens in the details." The details and unique camera shots make *Calling it Quits* a great movie. As in life, some of the greatest moments are when nothing is said. But the dialogue is well-written, with surprising and amusing twists, including some laugh-out-loud scenes. The story also leads us to some amazing and poignant places that we don't see coming.
